Originally started as a Women's History Week celebration in California in 1978, the concept eventually spread across the country. In 1980, a consortium of women's groups and historians lobbied for national recognition. In February 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued the first Presidential Proclamation declaring the first week of March as Women's History Week.

Diversity and Inclusion in Children's Books

The theme of Read Across America is celebrating diversity in early childhood literature. In 1985, less than 1 percent of children's books spotlighted Black characters—but by 2019, more than 12 percent of U.S.-published children's books featured Black characters, a significant improvement.
