Who We Are: A network of 75 Local Partnerships serving all 10 counties in North Carolina, dedicated to ensuring every child from birth-to-age five has the opportunity to thrive.

What We Do: We provide whole-child support from birth-to-five. We invest in early care and education, family support, and healthy families and communities.

- Early Care & Education: We work with child care providers to raise the quality of early learning.
- Family Support: We partner with families by offering resources and programs that encourage them to discover and lean into their own power,
- Child & Family Health: From birth to Kindergarten, we connect our community to services that promote physical, emotional, and mental well-being.
- Local Collaboratives: We convene and participate in collaboration among non-profits and across human service sectors. Through this collective impact approach, we work to shift systems.


A Visit from Congressman Greg Murphy

Are you ready to welcome new families to our community?

Every year approximately 600,000 military families - or roughly 33% of the all-volunteer force- relocate. Most of these families move to new duty stations, while some transition out of the military and others transition in.

While more than 70% of military families live off base in their local civilian communities, according to Blue Star Families' 2023 Military Family Lifestyle Survey, only 41% of respondents reported they felt a sense of belonging in their local community.

That's why we celebrate Blue Star Welcome Week from September 21st-29th. This week is an opportunity for Onslow County to welcome our military families and show them our appreciation for their service. Together, we can help ease

their transition through messages and actions of welcome, and opportunities to make meaningful connections.
