October is Head Start Awareness Month



Head Start programs provide early learning, health, and family support services to children and families. At One Place, our Early Head Start program is available to pregnant mothers, infants, and toddlers until age 3.

The first 2,000 days of a child's life are undeniably important—and many studies find that participation in Early Head Start has a long-term impact on a child's success.

Children who receive quality early learning and care (in programs like Head Start/Early Head Start) are 25 percent more likely to graduate high school, 4x more likely to have completed a bachelor's degree or higher, and earn up to 25 percent more in wages as an adult.

It's Not Too Late!

While the school year is officially in full swing, it's not too late to apply for preschool programs.

- -Research shows that state Pre-K programs have positive impacts on children's cognitive skills, including both pre-reading and pre-math skills.
- -Children who attended Pre-K usually have a higher grade point average and are more likely to graduate high school and college.
- -Fundamental skills like eye contact, self-confidence, work efficiency, attention span, and control of temper are developed during early childhood and are enriched in Pre-K.
